

Why was the Virgin Birth of Jesus Christ Necessary?

One of the best-known prophecies about the coming Messiah is found in Isaiah 7:14, where the Prophet says, "Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." This prophecy is shown to be fulfilled in the birth of Jesus Christ in Matthew 1:22-23 where he writes, "Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us."

Now, the miracle of the virgin birth of Jesus Christ is a spectacular and momentous fulfillment of Bible prophecy. But, other than a super-

natural occurrence to validate Bible prophecy and set apart the birth of our Saviour from all others, why is it so important? Or, to put it another way, why was the virgin birth so necessary?

To answer that question, we need to go back to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden. In Genesis 1:25-26 we see the creation of Adam and Eve:

And God made the beast of the earth after his kind, and cattle after their kind, and every thing that creepeth upon the earth after his kind: and God saw that it was good. And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth.

They were created pure and holy in the image of God. As such, they were without a sin nature and had complete fellowship with God. They, and all of creation, were in perfect harmony with the Creator. "And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good" (Genesis 1:31a).


Unfortunately, this blissful paradise was soon turned upside down. According to Genesis 2:16-17, Adam and Eve were given the freedom to eat from every tree in the garden except for one:

And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.

In the next chapter, however, we find Satan tempting Eve, in the guise of a serpent, to eat the forbidden fruit. She does and then offers the fruit to Adam who also partakes of it. Immediately, according to Genesis 3:7-8, they suffer the effects of their disobedience:

And the eyes of them both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and

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they sewed fig leaves together, and made themselves aprons. And they heard the voice of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day: and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God amongst the trees of the garden.

Now, before discussing the consequences of their disobedience, it is important to remember that God created Adam and Eve pure and holy. They had knowledge of good but not evil. That is because evil is not really the opposite of good, it is the absence of good in the same way that cold is actually the absence of heat and dark is the absence of light. Just as darkness is caused by taking away light and cold is caused by taking away heat, evil is caused by taking away good. Consequently, they had no knowledge of evil until their act of disobedience because they had never before experienced the absence of good. Only then could they have knowledge of both good and evil.

Other changes occurred as soon as Adam and Eve ate the forbidden fruit. Their eyes were opened “and they knew that they were naked” and then took steps to cover up their nakedness by sewing fig leaves together to fashion aprons. This, of course, brings about the question of their appearance prior to their disobedience. Were they walking around Eden naked or were they, perhaps, naked and not ashamed, as Genesis 2:25 says, because they were covered in some other way? I am not going to get into the reasons for it right now but, suffice to say, I believe that Adam and Eve were clothed with garments of light prior to their disobedience. After all, they were created in the image of God and the Bible says of God in Psalm 104:2, “Who coverest thyself with light as with a garment...”. If that light vanished when they ate the forbidden fruit, that might explain why they suddenly knew that they were naked.

Another change is that Adam and Eve’s fellowship with God was immediately broken. In Genesis 3:8-10 we read:

And they heard the voice of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day: and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God amongst the trees of the garden. And the LORD God called unto Adam, and said unto him, Where art thou? And he said, I heard thy

MINISTRY FOCUS



NURSING HOME OUTREACH MINISTRY

The Richfield Bible Baptist Church has, since its beginning, operated a nursing home outreach ministry. For many years we held a service every Saturday afternoon, eventually moving to Sunday afternoons when that time became available. The pandemic and resulting lockdowns in 2020 put the ministry on hold for over a year until we were invited back in this past summer. Unfortunately, we may now be seeing the end of our nursing home ministry, as may many church operated nursing home and assisted living services nationwide.



In November the U.S. Health and Human Services' Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), published the *CMS Omnibus COVID-19 Health Care Staff Vaccination Interim Final Rule* in the Federal Register (Vol. 86, No. 212 / Friday, November 5, 2021 / Rules and Regulations 61555). This rule is going to directly affect church nursing home and assisted living services, which are dependent on volunteers because, according to the *CMS Omnibus Staff Vax Requirements - External FAQ - Clean - Update 1 - 11.18.21*, volunteers are now required to be vaccinated:

*Q: Which staff are covered under this requirement? A: This vaccination requirement applies to eligible staff working at almost all CMS-certified facilities that participate in the Medicare and Medicaid programs, regardless of clinical responsibility or patient contact. The requirement includes all current staff as well as any new staff who provide any care, treatment, or other services for the facility and/or its patients. **This includes facility employees, licensed practitioners, students, trainees, and volunteers.** Additionally, this also includes individuals who provide care, treatment, or other services for the facility and/or its patients under contract or other arrangements. (p 2)*

*Q: What are the documentation requirements for staff vaccinations? Are these the same for vendors? A: As noted in the rule, this vaccination requirement generally applies to eligible staff working at a CMS-certified facility that participates in the Medicare and Medicaid programs, regardless of clinical responsibility or patient contact. The requirement includes all current staff as well as any new staff who provide any care, treatment, or other services for the covered facility and/or its 8 patients. **This also includes facility employees, licensed practitioners, students, trainees, and volunteers.** Additionally, individuals who provide care, treatment, or other services for the facility and/or its patients under contract or other arrangements must be vaccinated. (p 7-8)*

[Emphasis added]

Our church, as is the case with many of the churches operating nursing home and assisted living services, will not comply with or enforce the vaccine requirements on our volunteers. Quite frankly, even if we tried, most of the volunteers we depend on will not comply. Consequently, we will not be able to comply with the HHS rule and will be barred from nursing homes and assisted living facilities.

There are provisions for religious exemptions. But, in all reality, most care facilities will have neither the time nor the staff to deal with the paperwork such claims for exemptions on the part of volunteers entails especially for volunteers who may only be in the building a few times a month. Also, it may be that those who do get exemptions may actually be barred from being in contact with residents. Consequently, our concern is that this HHS rule may put an end to many nursing home and assisted living

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voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself.

This break of fellowship is a fulfillment of God's warning in Genesis 2:17, "...for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die."

But wait, you may object, doesn't the Bible tell us that Adam and Eve lived many years after eating the forbidden fruit? After all, Genesis 5:3 tells us that Adam and Eve were 130 years old when their son, Seth, was born. And, in Genesis 5:5, we find that Adam lived to the ripe old age of 930. That is a far cry from "...for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die."

Well, the answer lies in understanding that death is fundamentally a separation. Physical death, for instance, is when the soul and spirit are separated from the body. James refers to this in James 2:26, where he writes, "For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also." Remember, according to Genesis 2:7, Adam was not alive until God "breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul."

Consequently, when the soul and spirit leave the body, death occurs.

Physical death, however, is not the only kind of death. Spiritual death is the separation of God and man. When Adam and Eve disobeyed God it is evident that they did not experience physical death right away. They did, however, experience spiritual death. At that moment, the relationship between God and man was severed and they were now separated from their Creator. Specifically, their spirit, which once was in fellowship with God's Spirit, alive unto God, was now dead, separated from God. Consequently, instead of looking forward to and enjoying fellowship with God, we find Adam and Eve hiding fearfully from the One who created them.

Understanding spiritual death is vital to understanding why the virgin birth of Jesus Christ is necessary. As a result of Adam's disobedience, not only did Adam die spiritually that day, but all humanity did as well. In fact, the Bible says in Romans 5:12, "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for

that all have sinned". Therefore, every child born into this world, from Cain to the present, has a sin nature and must be born again.

Since God held Adam, not Eve, responsible for the entrance of sin into the world, this sin nature has evidently been passed from fathers to their children from generation to generation, all the way back to Adam. This means that Jesus Christ, if He had had an earthly father, would have inherited His earthly father's sin nature because Romans 5:12 tells us, "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned". Again in, 1 Corinthians 15:21-22, we read, "For

chromosome pair, and not female, with an XX chromosome pair. The only way that Jesus could be born male was for God to specially create a Y chromosome to complete the 23rd pair since females can only supply X chromosomes.


Consequently, according to Hebrews 2:9, "...we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man." Or, as Paul explained in Philippians 2:6-8, "Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

This is all brought together for us in the larger context of Romans 5:12-19:

Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned: (For until the law sin was in the

world: but sin is not imputed when there is no law. Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over them that had not sinned after the similitude of Adam's transgression, who is the figure of him that was to come. But not as the offence, so also is the free gift. For if through the offence of one many be dead, much more the grace of God, and the gift by grace, which is by one man, Jesus Christ, hath abounded unto many. And not as it was by one that sinned, so is the gift: for the judgment was by one to condemnation, but the free gift is of many offences unto justification. For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ.) Therefore as by the offence of one judgment came upon all men to condemnation; even so by the righteousness of one the free gift came upon all men unto justifi-

since by man came death, by man came also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive."

This, then, is why the virgin birth of Christ was necessary. Had Jesus had an earthly father, He would have inherited His earthly father's sin nature. And, if Jesus had been born with a sin nature, He could not have been, as Hebrews 7:26-27 says, our perfect, sinless "...high priest...who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners; Who needeth not daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifice, first for his own sins, and then for the people's..."

That is why the angel Gabriel said to Mary in Luke 1:35, "...The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God." In doing so, God built upon the 23 chromosomes of Mary's human DNA by creating an additional 23, thereby completing the full 23 pairs of chromosomes, to produce a unique person of both human and Divine origin. This is particularly evident in the fact that Jesus was born male, with an XY

Do you know what “Manuia le Kerisimasi ma le Tausaga Fou” means? Can you even pronounce it?

Many others live in communist states like China where atheistic officials ruthlessly persecute religious expressions and worship. Countries where Christmas — and Christianity — does not exist openly.

Sadly, many right here in the United States of America don't know the meaning of “Merry Christmas” anymore or are not allowed to express it. Think for example of how many nativity scenes used to be in front of town halls and schools and in city parks 50 or even 25 years ago. Where are they now? Banned!

What about the Christmas carols that we used to sing as children in the

public schools? In many schools in our country Santa, Rudolf, Frosty the Snowman, and their friends are still there. But what about Jesus, Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, the wise men, and the angels? Where are they? Outlawed!

Imagine that! Jesus, the reason for the season, banned and outlawed from our public schools, parks and town halls.

Even more disturbing, many of our homes do not know the meaning of “Merry Christmas” today either. For many, a merry Christmas is dependent on how many packages a chubby little man in a red suit can stuff down the chimney; how freely the Christmas cheer flows out of the bottles; how much food can be packed away for the lean summer months; or how the favorite ball team fares. Jesus is forgotten, overlooked, ignored, and Christmas becomes Xmas.

Let's put Christ back in Christmas! Having a merry Christmas means rejoicing in the birth of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. A truly merry Christmas means knowing that Jesus came into this world, born of the virgin Mary, to live a perfect, sinless life, to shed His blood for us at Calvary, and to rise victorious over death and sin that we might escape the damnation of hell and have forgiveness of sins and home in heaven for all eternity instead. Have you trusted Christ as your Saviour? If not, why not receive the greatest gift, the gift of eternal life through Jesus Christ today!

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cation of life. For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous.

Consequently, we can see from the Bible that the virgin birth of Jesus Christ was not just necessary, it is vital. Without it, there would be no Saviour. And if there were no Saviour, then there would be no hope. But, “Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift” (2 Corinthians 9:15), in that “...God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners,

Christ died for us” (Romans 5:8), “For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him” (2 Corinthians 5:21).

Or, as John put it in 1 John 4:9-10, “In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.”
