

## Our First Parents

We know from the first three chapters of Genesis that Adam and Eve were the first two human beings that God created. God created them on the sixth day, male and female; Adam first, then Eve.

*And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth. So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. (Genesis 1:26-27)*

They were the pinnacle of God's creation.

Adam, according to the Bible, is the first man and the father of us all. Every human being that

has ever lived is a descendent of Adam. Consequently, if this is true, shouldn't science be able to confirm it?

Well, it does! In fact, secular scientists studying genetics came to an interesting conclusion. Human beings have 23 pairs of chromosomes. One pair of chromosomes determines whether you are male or female. If you have the XX pair, you are female. If you have the XY pair, you are male. Consequently, the Y chromosome is only passed from the father to the son via the sperm cell as only males carry it. So, genetic scientists spent some time collecting DNA from men all around the world, of different backgrounds and races. They then isolated the Y chromosome DNA and analyzed it.

Do you have a Bible reading plan? I mean a plan that helps you to read your Bible on a consistent daily basis with some goal in mind. A plan of systematic, deliberate, persistent, habitual Bible reading that allows the Word of God to enter into you, fill you, and wash you. A plan that allows you to appreciate, enjoy, experience, and absorb God's Word on a daily basis while

feeding, strengthening, and improving your heart and mind.

After all, a good Bible reading plan is as essential to the growth and development of a Christian as milk is to a baby. First Peter 2:1-3 says, "Wherefore laying aside all malice, and all guile, and hypocrisies, and envies, and all evil speakings, As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby: If

so be ye have tasted that the Lord is gracious."

As we read the Bible we begin to grow stronger in our faith. Lack of reading stunts our spiritual growth, as illustrated in Hebrews 5:12-14: "For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat. For every one that useth milk is unskilful in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe. But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil."

A good Bible reading plan goes hand in hand with Bible study. For instance, Paul writes in 2 Timothy 2:15, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." Or, as the Old Testament puts it in Joshua 1:8, "This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success."

The more we read the Bible, the more we will find ourselves echoing Jeremiah's sentiment, found in Jeremiah 15:16: "Thy words were found, and I did eat them; and thy word was unto me the joy and rejoicing of mine heart: for I am called by thy name, O LORD God of hosts." The more we echo Jeremiah's words, the more we will find ourselves reading God's Word, meditating on God's Word, and growing in the knowledge and understanding of God's Word. After all, 2 Timothy 3:16-17 says, "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works."

Now, when I was younger, I really did not have much focus in my Bible reading, let alone a plan. My reading was sporadic and inconsistent at best. More often than not, I would open the Bible at random and start reading a few verses, maybe even a whole chapter. It was, I suppose, better than nothing.

A little later in my life I, while in college, I realized that I needed to read

### Bibleless Nations: Southern Aymara of Peru

*"And he said unto them,  
Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature."  
—Mark 16:15*



The ancient home of the Aymara is perched twelve-thousand feet above sea level on the Altiplano, a high plateau near Lake Titicaca in the Peruvian Andes. Although life is challenging due to very poor soil and a region susceptible to both drought and flood, the nearly three hundred thousand Southern Aymara have found a way to sustain a vibrant culture. Fulfilling social obligations is very important in these communities, which are usually composed of large family groups. Each person takes part in the husbandry and agricultural tasks that are central to their lifestyle.

To a casual visitor, it may seem the Aymara people have already embraced the Gospel. However, while the name of Jesus and the symbol of the cross are common, these people are just a step away from paganism. Four hundred years ago, they were

first introduced to Christianity by Catholic missionaries. In response to these new teachings, the Aymara simply blended Christian terminology and stories with animism, creating a folk-religion that worships both Jesus and natural "spirits."

The Southern Aymara have no Bible to lighten their darkness and expose the error of their beliefs. While the Central Aymara do have a Bible translation, its dialect is so different from Southern Aymara that it is considered to be an entirely different language. There is no Bible translation in process for the Southern Aymara. Meanwhile, they continue to live and die deceived and in darkness. ✠✠✠

# MINISTRY FOCUS



## MEETING IN A HOTEL ROOM?

One of the biggest challenges to getting a new church off the ground is finding a suitable and affordable place to meet. Commercial office space is expensive. Renting and repurposing an existing building can be challenging. And then there are the legal hoops to jump through as you negotiate building and zoning codes while making sure that you have all the necessary permits and inspections.

Nearly 12 years ago, our church was faced with these same challenges, but with two major differences. One, we were not a new church. Two, we had a very short timeframe in which we had to find a suitable and affordable place to meet. Nevertheless, we put our faith in the Lord and trusted that He would enable us to find a new place to meet.

We investigated several options but nothing quite worked out. Eventually, however, we ended up meeting in the meeting room at the Richfield Holiday Inn Express. Of course, it was only supposed to be temporary.

Now, nearly 12 years later, we find ourselves still meeting "temporarily" at the Richfield Holiday Express. Although we would still like to find a more permanent place to meet eventually, the hotel has provided certain advantages for a small church like ours. For instance, in the winter we do not have to worry about snowplowing and salting and in the summer we do not have to worry about lawn maintenance. We also do not have to worry about building and grounds maintenance and repairs in general. Another advantage is that our costs for the room are the same all year and include utilities and cleaning. When we were in our own building we were responsible for all these. Now, we simply pay one payment on Friday and one payment on Sunday.

Another advantage is that the hotel supplies the tables and chairs. When we moved out of the building that we had been renting, we had a number of chairs and tables on hand. However, new churches generally do not have churches and tables on hand so this can be a tremendous help for them. It was also a tremendous help for us since we do not have to try to transport tables and chairs for each service. Also, the hotel sets up and tears down the tables and chairs for each service, enabling us to just come in and set up our own things as needed.

Speaking of our own things, meeting in a hotel does present some unique challenges. We have to transport our song books, sound system, signs and banners, pulpit, coffee pots, literature and study materials, etc. to and from the hotel. Some hotels may provide sound systems and lecterns or podiums but ours does not. Moving all these materials back and forth can be a challenge, especially when all the luggage carts are taken. Nevertheless, with the help of sturdy plastic containers to keep everything dry and protected, materials and supplies can be packed away and easily transported. Some of the containers can easily be put use in other creative ways during services, such as the container that, with the edition of a cloth draped over it, becomes our pulpit.



Another set of challenges comes from having to adapt to and accommodate the needs of the hotel. However, being flexible is a big help in maintaining a good relationship with the owners, managers, and workers. Consequently, when we occasionally have to use the breakfast area or one of the upstairs suites, we adapt and accommodate. It also goes a long way when we occasionally have special requests to use some of the hotel's other facilities when we have special meetings and dinners. (Feeding hotel staff during our dinners goes a long way as well!)

All in all, our temporary stay in the hotel has been good for us. It has brought in visitors, given us an affordable place to meet, and enabled us to keep at the Lord's work. I would highly recommend it to any smaller church in need of a place to meet. ✠

the Bible more regularly and determined to read at least a chapter a day. I cannot say that I always did so, but at least it was a plan and it gave me something to aim for. It even motivated me to try to make up when I missed a chapter or two by reading extra chapters. Eventually, I managed to read the entire Bible, from Genesis to Revelation, for the first time.

After college, I joined the United States Air Force. While stationed in England, I rededicated my life to the Lord at a little Baptist missions work near our base and God brought me under conviction about my need to spend more time reading the Bible. I began trying various reading plans and found some were better than others but was not really satisfied with any of them.

Over time, however, I began to fashion my own plan, uniquely tailored to my own goals and reading style. I realized that I wanted several things from a Bible reading program. I wanted a plan that was easy to use, had realistic goals, and was easy to catch up with or get back on track if I missed some reading. I wanted to be able to read and compare both Old and New Testaments in conjunction with each other and provide familiarity with the contents of the Bible. I wanted a plan that would provide both inspiration and instruction. I also wanted a plan that provided continuity over the long term.

Eventually, I came up with a workable plan, tailored to my goals, which I have managed to keep up with since 1987. Although I have tweaked and adjusted it over the years, it has met my needs and has greatly improved my knowledge, understanding, and appreciation of God's Word. Consequently, I want to provide an outline of my personal Bible reading plan in the hope that it will inspire you to develop a plan that works for you.

Because I believe that God has preserved His Word for us in the Authorized King James Version, I use only the King James Bible for my Bible reading and study. In addition, I use separate Bibles for reading and study. The Bible I use for reading is relatively free from study notes, commentary, and references and has an easy to read font. That makes it easier to focus on just the text, so I can read without being distracted by extraneous information and material. In addition, I do not mark in my reading Bible for the same reason. I use my study Bible for that.

The most important part of my Bible reading plan involves reading through the Bible, alternating Old and New Testament books at the rate of five chapters a day. In

doing so, I started with the first book of the Old Testament, Genesis, followed by the first book of the New Testament, Matthew, followed by Exodus, then Mark, then Leviticus, then Luke, etc. I also keep a note card where I am reading to keep track of my progress and where I am, crossing off what I have read and noting what is next. I note the chapter that I will be starting in next time on right side of the card and on the left, I note what book I am in and what book is next. It looks something like this:

*Through the Bible Reading Record*  
~~1, 6, 11,~~ Genesis [previous book]  
 16, 21 Matthew [current book]  
 Exodus [next book]

Because there are 39 books in the Old Testament and only 27 in the New Testament, I find myself reading through the New Testament faster. Consequently, I started by reading Genesis followed by Matthew followed by Exodus followed by Mark followed by Leviticus and ended up reading Daniel followed by Revelation followed by Hosea followed by Matthew followed by Joel followed by Mark. By the time I reached the end of the Old Testament, I finished Malachi, and followed it by Colossians followed by Genesis followed by 1 Thessalonians followed by Exodus, etc.

Eventually, using this approach, I have been able to read every Old Testament book in conjunction with every New Testament book. I have found this approach much more helpful in comparing the various books of the Old and New Testaments side by side, seeing events and prophecies in the Old referred to and fulfilled in the New, than by reading from Genesis to Revelation.

In addition to reading five chapters a day, alternating between the Old and New Testaments, I also read several other chapters from various sections of the Bible, using note cards to help keep track of where I am reading:

1. Genesis-Ruth [the Law and history]
2. 1 Samuel-Job [history]
3. Psalms [prayer and praise]
4. Proverbs-Song of Solomon [wisdom]
5. Isaiah-Ezekiel [major prophets]
6. Daniel-Malachi [minor prophets]
7. Matthew-John [Gospels]
8. Acts-Romans [history and doctrine]
9. 1 Corinthians-2 Thessalonians [Pauline Epistles]

every male human being is the descendent of one original male. This original male they named "Y-chromosome Adam," the father of us all.

But what about Eve? The Bible identifies her as the first woman and the mother of us all (Genesis 3:20).

Geneticists have also come to some interesting conclusions regarding Eve. Like the Y chromosome in males, females also carry unique DNA that only comes from the mother. While most people assume that the DNA in the nucleus of our cells is all the genetic material we carry, we also have a small circular chromosome, called mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA), that occurs within the mitochondria in our cells. The mitochondria are small, energy producing organelles in the cells that are passed from the mother to her offspring via the egg cell.

By studying mitochondrial mtDNA from people all over the world, geneticists have discovered that every human being is descended from one original female. They have named this original female "Mitochondrial Eve," the mother of us all.

Interestingly, this supports Genesis 3:20, which says:

*And Adam called his wife's name Eve, because she was the mother of all living.*

Even more interesting is that geneticists have further determined that each person in the world has mtDNA that is one of three lines: M, N, or R. Since all three lines are found to be derived from the original mtDNA possessed by Mitochondrial Eve, that means that the whole of the human population, at some point in the past, was reduced to a small population of three reproducing females, descended from Mitochondrial Eve, who became the mothers of everyone born since that time.

Hmmm, where have we heard this before?

Well, in Genesis 7:11-14, the Bible relates:

*In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, in the second month, the seventeenth day of the month, the same day were all the fountains of the great deep broken up, and the windows of heaven were opened. And the rain was upon the earth forty days and forty nights. In the selfsame day entered Noah, and Shem, and Ham, and Japheth, the sons of Noah, and Noah's wife, and the three wives of his sons with them, into the ark; They, and every beast after his kind, and all the*

*cattle after their kind, and every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth after his kind, and every fowl after his kind, every bird of every sort.*

Later, after the flood waters receded and the ark rested on dry ground once more, the Bible tells us, in Genesis 9:18-19, that the three sons of Noah and their wives, not Noah and his wife, repopulated the world:

*And the sons of Noah, that went forth of the ark, were Shem, and Ham, and Japheth: and Ham is the father of Canaan. These are the three sons of Noah: and of them was the whole earth overspread.*

Of course, the secular geneticists would rather you did not pay attention to these Biblical accounts. Purely coincidence, they say. After all, the Bible is just an old book of myth and legend. Besides, according to the secular geneticists, Y-chromosome Adam and Mitochondrial Eve lived some 120,000-200,000 years ago. Much too long ago to correspond to

the mythical Adam and Eve of the Bible who lived only several thousand years ago. And as for the three women responsible for the M, N, and R mtDNA lines getting off Noah's ark? They are merely the dim, ancestral memories of an ancient cataclysm (but not a world-wide flood!) that nearly wiped out the human race.

Fortunately, there are some geneticists who believe the Bible and accept both the Genesis account of the creation of Adam and Eve being some 6000 or so years ago and the cataclysmic flood of Noah's day occurring about 4500 years ago. By investigating of the rate of mutations in Y chromosomes and mtDNA, they have discovered that the actual mutation rates and accumulations of mutations are considerably different than what the secular scientists initially assumed and actually much closer to the Bible suggests.

For instance, recent studies of paternal ancestry indicates that the per-generation mutation rate of Y chromosome DNA is about 10-17 times faster than the previously published rate. Consequently, if humans

have been around for hundreds of millions of years, we should find much higher amounts of mutations than we currently observe in Y-chromosome DNA. Instead, according to molecular biologist Dr. Nathaniel T. Jeanson and statistician Ashley D. Holland, in a 2019 paper published in Answers Research Journal, which is published by Answers In Genesis, we only observe about 6000 years of mutation accumulations in the Y chromosome as opposed to hundreds of millions of years' worth ("Evidence for a Human Y Chromosome Molecular Clock: Pedigree-Based Mutation Rates Suggest a 4,500-Year History for Human Paternal Inheritance," <https://answersingenesis.org/theory-of-evolution/molecular-clock/evidence-human-y-chromosome-molecular-clock/>).

Studies of mtDNA have yielded similar results. In fact, Dr. Jeanson, in a 2016 paper published in Answers Research Journal, found that the secular models suggest there should be a minimum of 681 differences in mtDNA, whereas the Biblical young earth models suggest a maximum of 123. The observed diversity in mtDNA is a maximum of 123 ("On the Origin of Human Mitochondrial DNA Differences, New Generation Time Data Both Suggest a Unified Young-Earth Creation Model and Challenge the Evolutionary Out-of-Africa Model," <https://answersingenesis.org/genetics/mitochondrial-dna/origin-human-mitochondrial-dna-differences-new-generation-time-data-both-suggest-unified-young-earth/>).

Thanks to the completion of the Human Genome Project and recent developments in our knowledge and understanding of DNA, we are finding that true science upholds and supports the Biblical accounts of creation and a cataclysmic world-wide flood. In doing so, it also upholds and supports the Bible in general. And, if it does that, it makes it reasonable to accept what the Bible says about other things, such as the need for a Saviour, as well. †††

10. 1 Timothy-Philemon [Pastoral Epistles]
11. Hebrews-Jude [doctrine]
12. Revelation [prophecy]

(You can come up with your own divisions.)

At one time, I endeavored to read a chapter from each of these sections every day. Today, however, I read a chapter or two from Psalms and a chapter from the Proverbs-Song of Solomon section each day. In addition, I read a chapter from one of the other sections on an Old-New Testament alternating basis, a book at a time (I know, it is confusing but it works for me...). This further helps me travel all over the Bible fairly quickly, comparing books and passages between both Testaments and within them.

Of course, there are many of plans available to help you read through your Bible. You can follow a plan like mine or make up one of your own. You can follow a plan to read the whole Bible in a year, checking off the each day's assigned portion as you go or you could embark on your own cover to cover reading adventure without a time frame. Reading just a chapter a day will get you through the Bible in a little over three years. Two chapters a day will get you through the Bible in about a year and a half. Read five chapters and you can read the entire Bible

in just under eight months. You can even read the Bible chronologically from the oldest book written (Job) to the most recent (Revelation).

The point is, while there are many Bible reading plans available, the most important thing is that you actually read the Bible. You need to find a plan that works for you. You need to find a plan that will challenge you to commit to reading God's Word but is not so difficult or demanding that you get discouraged and stop reading.

Whatever plan you use, however, the most important thing is that you get into the habit of reading your Bible on a daily basis and stick with it. Even if you only read one verse a day, it is better than reading no verse each day. And, who knows, you might find that by reading a verse a day you can do two or three, maybe even a whole chapter or more. No matter what plan you use, just get into God's Word and read. Enjoy it. Let it soak into you and fill you. It will change you, for the better.

*"Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful. 
